1 - YEAR 2 VISIT BY ROMFORD FIRE BRIGADE

Year 2 children have been learning all about The Great Fire of London in History since returning from the Christmas holidays, which they are really enjoying. Romford Fire Brigade came to visit us last Friday and showed us all of the fantastic work they do. They also spoke about how things have changed and improved in order to keep us safe in the modern day. The children loved going into the cabin of the fire truck, where they were shown some of the high tech gadgets that are used, such as a thermal imaging camera and other electric tools that the fire brigade would use to help save people's lives. The children also learnt about the breathing equipment that helps protect the fire officers when they are tackling fires. How times have changed since the Great Fire of London!



















INTERNET SAFETY - ROBLOX



Roblox is a platform consisting of a collection of games. Players can either create games or play games that other users have created. Please be aware that a lot of the content is user generated, which may mean not all games will be suitable for your child to view/play so it is very important to set up appropriate parental controls for your child.

What rating is Roblox? PEGI rate Roblox with a Parental Guidance label because it is difficult to rate due to the huge level of user generated content. It is rated for 'Teens' on Google Play and 12+ on the App store.

What should parents/carers be aware of?

Chat Facility - Players can chat to each other on Roblox. You can turn communication off completely or add restrictions, such as only communicate with friends.

Virtual Currency - Players can buy Robux (their virtual currency) to buy in-game upgrades or accessories. For children under 13, you can set the Monthly Spend Restriction in settings.

Game content - as mentioned, users create games so sometimes the content/themes may not be appropriate for your child.

How to set up parental controls and a pin?

Parental controls are available within settings. You can enable a PIN, which means that changes cannot be made without this pin. You can set up Allowed Experiences, which allows you to select ageappropriate experiences, so your child can only join experiences that match their age. Age categories available are for all, 9+, 13+ and 17+. All experiences are still searchable though.

PARENT SURVEY



We are delighted to share the results of our Parent Survey carried out during the summer term 2023.

Q13 I know how my child is progressing at school/nursery and how I can help their learning at home. 93% of parents agreed with this statement and 7% disagreed. It is great to see that the vast majority of our parents agree that we do our utmost to ensure parents are fully informed about their child's progress and how they can support their child at home. As you are aware we have Parent Consultations termly and Target forms are shared. Homework is set weekly. The most important thing you can do to support your child is READ daily! Teachers are here to answer any queries and give further support if needed. All you need to do is ask!

Q14 I know enough about what my child is learning at home. 96% of parents agreed with this statement and 4% disagreed. Curriculum letters are sent home termly giving an overview of the things the children are learning. Homework also links to lessons in class. Once again teachers are more than happy to give further information if required - just ask!

Q15 There is no bullying or racial abuse at school/nursery. 92% of parents agreed with this statement and 8% disagreed. The school has very well behaved and respectful children. Any child who is not behaving as expected will receive additional support to understand the consequences of their action. The HT is very happy to meet with any parents to discuss concerns and deals with these situations as a matter of urgency. We want every child to be happy in our school.

3 - PROTECT YOURSELF AND YOUR PROPERTY

We have received the following information from the Metropolitan Police regarding keeping yourself and your mobile phone safe.

- Be aware of your surroundings. Look up Look out. Do NOT confront a thief safety comes first!
- Avoid walking with ear pods or expensive clothing on display, Designer brands appeal to teenagers and thieves
- Avoid isolated places, perhaps travel with a friend
- Each phone has a unique IMEI number. Type *#o6# and record it and leave a copy at home.
- Use two-factor authentication codes
- Use tracker apps, like 'Find My Phone', and keep login at home
- Know your details in case your phone is stolen this helps Police investigation. If you are robbed report to the police as soon as possible. If the suspect is nearby call 999.
